1.0 Presidents Report

As I come to the end of my two years as President I can look back with some satisfaction, in that we have emerged from the Pandemic and associated lockdown intact as an organisation. In the last twelve months we have been able to stage all of our usual events. Audience levels were down on previous pre-corvid levels, and this seems to be reflected in camera club meetings. While a fair majority of clubs are back with live meetings each week, there are some that are still alternating between live meetings and zoom sessions.

The PAGB Executive meetings are still being held at the Warwick University Conference Centre, which has proved to be an excellent meeting place, which also saves the PAGB money compared to our old London venue.

Applications to the PAGB Awards Scheme are still running at a lower level than the Pre-Pandemic level. This is probably due to a lower level of activity in clubs. Hopefully this will now improve in the year ahead.

Can I end by saying what an honour it has been to serve as President over the last two years. I have thoroughly enjoyed the experience and I would like to thank all of the members of the Executive for making the job easy and enjoyable.

3.2 Subscriptions

In accordance with the decisions taken at the 2021 AGM and the Executive Committee meeting in October 2021, the Subscription rate was discounted by 50%.

That removed over £16K from Subscription income.

3.3 Notes on the Accounts

The majority of our normal events were reintroduced during 2022 and the expenditure reflects that. I draw attention to the following:

- Deficit The General Fund shows a deficiency of £11K, cf. £3K that was budgeted. There were many variances from Budget but the most significant related to Subscriptions (see 2 above). The Executive Committee decided that we had done enough to appropriate almost the whole of the balance of the Sponsorship Fund.
- **Publicity** The stand rental at The Photography Show was again paid in full by the exhibition organisers' sponsoring us.
- **Executive Committee Meetings** Because of the way in which our contracts with Warwick University are written, it is no longer possible to differentiate between Accommodation and Room Hire. The latter heading will vanish in due course.

5.0 Insurance

I never thought that having taken over from Richard Speirs the insurance role in 2021, that by the beginning of 2022, Simon Henderson the new CEO of Darwin Clayton would inform me that they could no longer insure the PAGB, as I reported in the 2021 annual review, the Royal Sun Alliance (RSA) are no longer going to underwrite the PAGB policy from the **1st February 2023**.

Although Darwin Clayton (UK) limited tried to find an alternative, they were unsuccessful, leaving me to find a replacement. The large insurance companies were unwilling to insure a 1,000 clubs for public liability as they didn't have the infrastructure and pointed me in the direction of insurance brokers. After a number of false leads I found a company that was willing to work with the PAGB in Mobberley Cheshire – **yourGadgetscovered.com**. After many phone calls and a visit to explain the structure of the PAGB / Federations / Photographic Clubs, **yourGadgetscovered.com** found an underwriter AXA.

yourGadgetscovered.com are part of a larger organisation **Hive Insurance Services**. Through their Technical Director John Sant, Isaac Lam CEO of Hive, I managed to secure a similar deal that we enjoyed with Darwin Clayton (UK) Itd, and in fact the public liability and management liability was more cost effective.

I should point out, that my remit as insurance officer did not include any other insurance that clubs may or may not wish to take out, such as 'all risks', as my brief was to find the best and cost effective insurance polices for public liability / management liability

However I did have a barrage of complaints regarding "All Risk Cover" As Public Liability is the mandatory cover for a number of federations, I asked Hive to focus on Public Liability when looking for an insurer for the PAGB, and in that respect, they gave the PAGB a competitive offering.

The All Risk Cover is slightly out, but this is because the new insurer works in bands $(\pounds1,500 / \pounds2,500 / \pounds5,000 / \pounds7,500 / \pounds10,000 / \pounds15,000)$ and everyone is having to choose the best band, in many cases rounding up. But **Hive Insurance Services** have committed to reviewing this benefit with the insurer later this year to secure better rates.

It's worth pointing out that not all insurance plans offer the same benefits, so comparing on premium alone may not always give the complete story. Much like car and home insurance, some insurer's may offer first year discounts to gain clients only for premiums to increase in future years. Hives plans have not been created with this in mind – they are looking to create long-term relationship with the PAGB

A note from Hives Insurance Services CEO Isaac Lam

'I can reassure you that when we sit down and review this arrangement with the insurer later this year, we will look to improve the All Risk solution now that we know exactly what clubs need and want. By then, the insurer will also have built up some claims and trading experience with the Association and should be more comfortable to lower their rates .'



You can only apply on line through the PAGB website (http://www.thepagb.org.uk/) and follow the link from the front page, where you will find an application form. The clubs and federations can use the same form.

Payment is by credit card, as this keeps the cost down.

Lastly, for your peace of mind I just wanted to remind clubs that our insurance is sourced through AXA (via HIVE Insurance Services), a name most of us will recognise. They are a leading insurer in the public liability sector with a strong reputation for providing high quality cover supported by strong levels of customer service.

6.0 Standards and Governance

The Subcommittee manages the Breach of Rules Procedure, and otherwise delivers projects as required by the Executive.

One case was referred from BPE under the Breach of Rules Procedure and awaits Executive decision.

A discussion document was presented to the Executive on the relationships and responsibilities between Clubs, Federations and the PAGB.

Several projects have been completed or are in progress in support of longer term aims identified by the Strategy Subcommittee.

Training on the Executive's ownCloud shared document storage system was provided for Executive members as required. User documentation was written and distributed.

Further to the agreed specification for an on-line speakers register, and redevelopment of the CES (Central Entries System) to provide new login and new methods for approving Club members, Club officers and Federation officers:

- There was extensive testing of the new CES.
- CES user documentation was prepared and is regularly updated with any changes.
- CES data quality was reviewed and improved where possible.
- The Executive discussed and agreed new standard terms for speakers and bookings to be used with the on-line register.
- Training was provided for Federations and their appointed data managers, and ongoing support is available.
- All judges in the existing PAGB handbook 2022/2023 were added by Federations, although some judges have still to add a password to complete their account. Judges on the PAGB accredited list had that accreditation added to their record.
- Speakers' Lectures and some Workshops are being recruited to the register. This is being managed by Federations, and the process is ongoing.

The Online Advisory Service continues to receive requests for advice on a regular basis. The total number who have applied for advice since the service was established on a permanent basis is in excess of 210. Given that a significant number have received advice from more than one advisor (some progressing from CPAGB to DPAGB) and most advisors provide at least two sessions of guidance, it is likely over 500 advice sessions have been provided under the service. Many have commented that they would not have been successful without the service they received and advisors often find the process to be rewarding. As one wrote "After more than 30 odd successful candidates over the past few years, both from PAGB and YPU adviser initiative, it is still one of the most enjoyable things I do".

13.0 PAGB Website

The main website at thepagb.org.uk continued in 2022 and the hosting package was renewed. The server software and WordPress versions were advanced as updates became available.

The purpose of the web site is to host definitive information so that it is available whenever required. The web site was regularly read through to assure content accuracy, to identify errors and broken links, and to manage updates as required. Reports and image galleries for events were added as they became available.

All administrative information in the PAGB Handbook not already on the website was migrated to the website. A Compendium document was created and published as a description and index to the website pages and supporting documents. The Compendium is available to all but will be of most use to club and federation committee members when the Handbook is no longer produced in its current format.

The website includes a contact form for enquiries with protection to prevent spam messages. All contacts and outcomes are logged. In 2022, 45 contacts were reported to the Executive. The questions mostly relate to accessing individual current PAGB events, with increasing questions about the CES as that system has expanded in use. They can usually be answered immediately, with only a few needing referral to a specific Executive member.

Announcements were made and updated on the Home page but the Alliance's principal news service remains PAGB e-news. The website at pagbnews.co.uk hosts PAGB e-news, and is reported separately.

The website at pagbhost.co.uk hosts the entries/administration system (CES) and the Executive's shared document server and is reported separately.



18.0 FIAP Liaison

18.1 FIAP Distinctions

A total of 116 applications for FIAP distinctions, sent to FIAP in 2022, were successful. This figure is down on 2021 (124). All those submitted from the PAGB were successfully awarded the relevant distinction apart from one application where FIAP considered one of the portfolio images was too similar to a portfolio image submitted in a previous successful application.

The successful entries are listed in appendix b.

There were two applications for the distinction of MFIAP but neither was successful.

18.2 FIAP Biennials

In the 21st Nature Biennial the PAGB gained first place, with the World Cup, for Prints and achieved 4th place, with a Bronze Medal, for Digital Images. Judging took place in Turkey.

In the 35th Black & White Print Biennial the PAGB achieved 3rd place and a Silver Medal.

This was a great result for which everybody involved should be justifiably proud. Our thanks must go to Adrian Lines of the FIAP Sub-Committee for his work in organising the entries.

18.3 Patronage

During 2022 seven International Salons enjoyed FIAP Patronage. These were Midland, Cheltenham, Jurassic Coast (AV), Smethwick, Northern Counties, Southampton and Bristol – an increase of 2 from 2021.

18.4 FIAP Information

The 35th FIAP Congress and 9th General Assembly of FIAP was held in Oviedo, Asturias, Spain from 1st to 4th December 2022. The main points from the Congress were:

The proposed new distinctions requirements were dropped. However, we revert back to the pre-covid rules from 1st January 2024 so A and E will require prints acceptances. Applicants fees to also return to pre-covid levels from 1st January 2024.

The Russia member resigned but the spot was then taken by another organisation from Russia and the vote went the way of admitting that member, I voted against.

The 2024 Congress remains set for India, date currently unknown but will probably be later in the year.

The 2023 photo meeting will be held in Northern Spain in June, exact dates and itinerary not yet conformed. Spain won against Armenia which to me would have been a more suitable place to visit.



All FIAP fees to remain at their current level.

Report to the PAGB AGM on Saturday 15th April from the EAF.

Like many Federations, we are still suffering the after-effects of the pandemic and we are now at our lowest club membership for many years. For our two recent Championship weekends the club entry was lower than we would have hoped for, but we have four clubs ready to represent the Federation at Warwick and Blackburn, two having gained automatic entry due to their performances at the PAGB Championships last year.

On a more positive side we ran a live APM Advisory Day last September with quite a good turnout. It was pleasing to see many people in person and not on Zoom. We also ran a Judges' Workshop in November with four new judges being appointed and two promoted. These two events will be repeated this autumn.

At present, we are busy preparing for our annual Exhibition, which opens on 29th April.

An event the EAF has recently taken over is our regional Audio-Visual Trophy Competition which had been run previously by the Essex A-V Group over the last 29 years. Finding it difficult to recruit younger members to take on responsibility for organising it, the EAF Executive was asked whether they would consider taking it over. This was agreed and we are holding the first event on Saturday 14th October this year, with two top A-V workers assessing the entries. We have also gratefully received PAGB Patronage for it.

We are hoping that we can get back to the pre-pandemic levels of club support over the next year or so.

L&CPU Report to the PAGB AGM, April 2023

During 2022 club membership remained largely unchanged at 91 clubs, albeit with a continuing overall small fall in the membership of federated clubs. The Federation completed its emergence from the Covid pandemic and ran a full programme of events including the Annual Club- and Individual competitions in both prints and PDIs, the Digital Knockout Competition and the more recently introduced Bob Robinson Trophy print competition for federated club photographers without photographic honours. Our Annual Exhibition and Awards Presentation was staged as usual; this year at Leigh Spinners Mill. The Federation competed with some success in the PAGB Inter-federation competition and was represented at both the PAGB Annual Club PDI and print competitions by elected clubs as well as two clubs qualifying by dint of having been finalists in the previous year. The Federation was represented by individuals from a number of clubs in the PAGB Masters of Print competition. We ran, with great success, a Big Day of Photography in which, shock horror, participants were enabled to make photographs of a number of models within the iconic Leigh Spinners Mill as well as enjoy presentations on a variety of topics. The Federation newsletter, Focal Points, has gone from strength to strength and has become a major contributor to keeping club members informed of what is going on around the region and beyond. During the year approximately 30 issues were published, reaching an estimated 1000 of our club's members. Financially, the Federation remains strong. There was no significant change to the balance sheet.

Report from the Northern Counties Photographic Federation

The NCPF AGM was held on Sunday 26th March 2023 and attracted a reasonable number of representatives.

Although a few clubs have bucked the trend, the majority of NCPF clubs are working with reduced membership post-covid and we even have the imminent closure of the very long-standing Sunderland Photographic Association a club with a proud record dating back to 1888 - 135 years of history. Two other long standing clubs have also indicated their likely closure at the end of April.

To aid clubs with membership recruitment and retention volunteers from the Executive Committee have formed a Club Support and Development sub-committee who are seeking to help any clubs that are struggling, while learning from and sharing best practice.

Training for prospective new judges with refresher training for current judges and Competition Secretaries will take place on 2nd April.

The Club Championship competition was a success with the number of clubs entering creeping up. Entries for the Annuals Competition are coming in, encouragingly with entries from some clubs who have not entered for many a year.

Northern Focus e-magazine continues to spread the story of our region and beyond with celebration of success.

At 46 pages the 93rd Edition of "Northern Focus" was presented with two awards from the Photographic Society of America dated 30th September 2022.

The 94th Edition of "Northern Focus" at 56 pages celebrated the magazines Golden Anniversary, featuring a write-up by our Honorary Life Vice President Stan Bewick regarding the very first issue and how it came about.

Northern Counties International Salon

Where we are now:

- PhotoComp Software will no longer be supported from December (other software available).
- Primarily as a result of illness of the Chairman the 2022 Salon lost money due to an excessively tight schedule and short entry window reducing entries. c1700 entries from 164 entrants. The Break Even was estimated at c250 entrants.

 Many of the NCPF Executive are ambivalent regards running further Salons. A few are vociferously opposed to running further Salons.

At the AGM it was resolved that

The International Salon Chairman role will be left open within NCPF for next 24 months (as vacant).

Any volunteer(s) to raise the case with NCPF for re-start as 42nd Northern Counties International Salon – or perhaps as another name. If no takers: Close our Salon at the AGM 2025.

Election of Officers

A number of Executive Members have resigned leaving important vacancies. Although we have recruited a new Treasurer our Webmaster has tendered his resignation and no replacement has come forward. Likewise the role of Publication Officer formerly held by Pax Garabedian remains unfilled, however, the NCPF Secretary, Margaret Welsh has volunteered to compile a basic Club Directory for 2023/24. It is hoped that in future this will be replaced by the PAGB CES database although a number of clubs attending the AGM did report difficulties accessing and updating their information. Potentially some training will be needed to bring people up to date about CES.

Sadly it appears that the lack of volunteers to take on roles within the Executive is a reflection of the fact that so many clubs are struggling to recruit committee members.

Report to PAGB AGM April 2023

The long-lasting effects of Covid are still affecting some of our clubs, with some members still not feeling ready to meet face to face again and many clubs reporting both substantially reduced committees and numbers of volunteers prepared to help. We lost two clubs last year, but picked up two new clubs following the demise of both the Sussex Federation and the Stour and Avon Photographic Association and so membership levels remain at 70. Clubs who have been offering hybrid meetings since the pandemic are mostly trying to return to either club nights or zoom nights, rather than struggle and dilute the attendance at both. And I am sure like most Federations, our clubs are concerned about the best ways for recruitment of new, and dare I say, younger members.

We continue to urge clubs to hold our PDI league matches via Zoom to encourage members to look beyond their own clubs for photographic inspiration and to be more aware of successful images. It has also been pleasing to see that a number of clubs who hold special interest groups, for either encouragement for members working toward distinctions or covering more specific topics are opening these evenings up to other clubs and some are sharing zoom evenings. Our championships this last weekend had the highest attendance for many years with a number of new clubs taking part.

The SCPF are experimenting with zooming out major events such as our reps' meetings, AGM, exhibition preview and championships to make clubs, from further afield, namely the Isle of Wight, Channel Islands and Gibraltar feel more engaged with the Federation. We have another judges training programme scheduled for a couple of months' time and this is expected to include members from all these clubs.

We are delighted that two of our senior judges were made PAGB approved judges in February and are hopeful at the time of completing this report that premises for next year's APMs in our region have now been identified.

REPORT FROM THE WELSH PHOTOGRAPHIC FEDERATION – March 2023

* Over the past twelve months we have thankfully seen a return to some kind of normality following the Covid pandemic. Our thanks go to our Immediate Past President Jenny Hibbert for guiding us through this difficult period.

It was sad to see that some clubs had been affected by the Covid situation, both financially and in the reduced numbers of members attending meetings. It was also noticable that the number of clubs entering print based competitions had declined, but is now slowly improving. This seems to be a trend across the UK. Many clubs in Wales are returning to regular face to face meetings and Zoom still features in some clubs' programmes. It's encouraging to note that this year a new club has joined the WPF and another is currently going through the approval process which will bring our total to 51 WPF Clubs.

* The WPF was proud to host the PAGB Inter Federation Competition in June and then to exhibit the successful prints at Swansea's Quadrant Shopping Centre during July, in partnershiip with 'Pop-Up Wales'. This proved very successful indeed with numerous visitors each day, which in turn increased the footfall at the Shopping Centre.

* Our WPF Annaul Convention took place at The Heronsden Hotel, Bridgend in August in hybrid format. Our speakers were Leigh Preston, Sue O'Connell, Peter Brisley and Chris Palmer.

* We held our annual award for AWPF in November and 9 people gained their distinctions.

* The Welsh International Salon took place in December with a noticeable downturn in entries, once again likely due to COVID. However, it proved successful with a high standard of photographs.

* This year 2023 we have held our WPF Competitions -

The Memorials Trophies, hosted by Newquay Camera Club, took place in January. The winning prints were exhibited at Bridgend Indoor Market throughout March.

The Ace of Clubs took place in February. This is when two clubs are selected to represent the WPF at the PAGB Inter Federation Competition. Bridgend and District CC and Gwynfa CC were the successful clubs.

The Welsh Salon selections was held on 19 March. The selected prints and images will be exhibited throughtout May at The Cynon Valley Museum, Aberdare. The Offical Opening of the Salon takes place on 13 May when the Welsh Salon awards will be presented.
